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### Caseggiato dei Molini

- 1 Via dei Molini, from the north. To the left, behind part of a millstone, are two small rooms set against the west facade of the Grandi Horrea. To the right is the east facade of the bakery.<sup>2</sup> Via dei Molini, from the south-west. To the right are two small rooms set against the west facade of the Grandi Horrea.
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- 5 Relief with carpenters' tools in the facade, shortly after the excavation (see also plate 4).
- 6 Part of the east facade: room 8 and staircase 9. Between the rooms was once a relief.
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- 8 Room 7, basalt block of the floor with the imprint of a hoof.
- 9 Room 8, north wall, west part. To the left is a blocked doorway, in the upper right part a small window.
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- 11 Staircase 9, south wall, from the north-east. To the left is a fissure, to the right a row of holes, related to the staircase.
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- 13 Room 17, south wall, west part. Note the beamholes and putlogholes.
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- 15 Rooms 21-19, from the north-west. To the left are the remains of a large basin.
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- 29 Cas. di Diana. Room with floor of basalt blocks and trough. It may have been part of the bakery.

### Molino I, XIII, 4

- 30 West facade along the Cardo Maximus, from the south. Note the travertine columns in front of rooms 1-5.
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 51 The west end of the north wall of entrance 14, from the south-west.  
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### Caseggiato delle Fornaci

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 82 Interior of the former shop 42, from the south.  
 83 Room 44, in which the oven was located. From the east.

### Caseggiato dei Dolii

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### Caseggiato I,IX,2

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 88 Oven in room 12, from the north-west.

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 90 Blocked opening in the back wall of the oven (prior apsis), from the west.  
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 93 Several rooms belonging to the bakery, below Exedra I,XII,3, discovered in 1996. Note the floors of basalt blocks. Not investigated by the authors. From the south-east.  
 94 Room 3, south-east corner. Note the absence of bricks in the lower part of the central section. From the north-west.

95 The vestibule of the Piazza d'Oro in the Villa Hadriana, Tivoli. Part of the bakery was installed in a similar structure.

**Inscriptions**

96 CIL XIV, 374. Erected in honour of M. Licinius Privatus by the *fabri tignuarii* (c. 198 AD). Later *quaestori et q(uin)q(uennali) corporis pistorum Ostiens(ium) et Port(ensium)* was added (line 7).
